FERPA AND STUDENT RIGHTS

The Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) is a federal law that protects the privacy of student education records. To comply with this law, IU Indianapolis must receive written permission from the student to release any form of personally identifiable information including university ID number, grades/exam scores, GPA, current class schedule, disciplinary status, etc.

Your student has the ability to authorize another person to view specific information by granting third-party access through One.IU (e.g., bursar bills, holds on their account, grades, class schedule, unofficial transcript, and final exam schedules).

THIRD-PARTY ACCESS GUIDE

Discuss third-party access with your student and follow the steps below.

- 1. Have your student access one.iu.edu.
- 2. Search for "Third-Party User" or "Parent Access."
- 3. Follow the on-screen instructions.

Note: Your student will assign a username and passphrase to you. Your student is the only person who can retrieve a new username and passphrase if lost.

BURSAR'S OFFICE

If you or your student needs support in paying your bursar bill, the Bursar's office is here to help. Bills are created on the third Thursday of each month, and payments are always due by the 10th of the next month. J.A.G.S. VEHICLE ASSISTANCE

IU INDIANAPOLIS LINGO (JAG SPEAK):

CrimsonCard: Indiana University's official student photo ID card.

JagLine: A free and efficient shuttle system to get around campus.

Jags: Short for Jaguars, which is the official mascot of IU Indianapolis. There are three Jaguar mascots: Jinx, Jawz, and Jazzy.

One.IU: The online platform used to access various campus services and information.

The Spot: IU Indianapolis's online student engagement platform to connect with registered student organizations and events.

The CUBE: A supportive, inclusive workspace for students which serves as the student organization resource center. There are plenty of lounge spaces to relax, network, enjoy lunch, and take a quick study break between classes.

DoSA: The Division of Student Affairs consists of nine student-focused units that help students find their version of success and prepare them for life after college.

Natatorium (NAT): A swimming and diving facility located on campus.

Carroll Stadium: An outdoor stadium on campus used for track and field events and soccer games.

Office of the Registrar: The office responsible for maintaining student records, including transcripts and class schedules.

Office of Student Financial Services:

The office responsible for assisting students in exploring the different types of financial aid (e.g., scholarships, grants, loans, and federal work study) available to help them attend IU Indianapolis.

Office of the Bursar: The office responsible for billing and collecting tuition and fees.

Multicultural Center: The Multicultural Center seeks to support the entire student population by promoting the value of diversity, broadening multicultural awareness and sensitivity, advancing cultural competence, and encouraging cross-cultural collaborative relationships through retention, engagement, and education.

LGBTQ+ Center: It serves as a lighthouse for LGBTQ+ resources and as a landing ground to find community on campus.

AES: Accessible Educational Services is the disability services office for IU Indianapolis. The office determines if a student qualifies for accommodations, approves reasonable accommodations, and serves the campus community to ensure the implementation of those accommodations whenever possible.

Handshake: The career services platform utilized by campus. Internships and job opportunities are posted on Handshake by employers specifically looking to hire students.

CROF: Campus Recreation Outdoor Facility is home to volleyball pits, basketball courts, and green space for games and activities. It's located at the corner of University Blvd. and W. North St.

National Institute for Fitness and Sport (NIFS): Included in the Campus Recreation membership, students will have access to this facility along with full-service training and coaching options.

Jaguar Campus Recreation (The Jag):

A facility in the Lower Level of the Campus Center that provides students access to intramural sports, fitness programs, and recreational opportunities.






